Levels of nurturing practice

Bev Selway - NGN consultant

Bev has been working in education for more than 35 years. Prior to becoming an NGN consultant, Bev worked in Merton as part of the behaviour support team. She also acts as a regional co-ordinator for NGN. In this session, Bev will explore the different levels that schools can embed a nurturing ethos. Using the nurture pyramid as a base for implementing nurture in different ways, Bev will offer anecdotes and examples from MBQMA and NNSP awarded schools as to how they have used the nurture approach in their creative practice. Bev will give examples of activities schools are using to support wellbeing for nurture rooms, classrooms and even on a whole school level.
